Legal Requirements for Work Based Learning

Title 5 Section 55250.3 Definition

Work-experience education authorized by this article includes the employment of students in part-time jobs selected and approved as having educational value for the **students employed** therein and **coordinated** by **college employees.**

Title 5 Section 55252:

General Work Experience Education

Occupational Work Experience Education

Cooperative Work Experience Plan

Title 5 Section 55250: Plan Required for CWE

Plan **adopted by the district** must set forth a systematic design of CWE whereby students, while enrolled in college, will gain realistic learning experiences through work. Approved plan **submitted to CCCO**.

(Sample in Training Notebook)

Requirements of the CWE Plan

Title 5 Section 55251: Requirements of the College/District CWE Plan

- 1)Approved by Board of Trustees
- 2) Description of responsibilities of Key Staff
- 3) Specific description for each type of CWE (General or Occupational).

Student to Instructor Ratio in CWE

Title 5 Section 58051(b)

. . . The student/instructor ratio in the CWE program shall not exceed 125 students per full-time equivalent academic coordinator.

Calculating CWE Credit

Title 5 Section 55256.6:

- Each 75 hours of paid work equals one semester credit or 50 hours equals one quarter credit. CANNOT use SWP Funds to Pay STUDENTS.
- Each 60 hours of non-paid work equals one semester credit or 40 hours equals one quarter credit.
- Can include Orientation Time.
- Course repeatability College/district policy. (Title 5 Section 55040)

Labor Code Requirements for CWE Programs

California Labor Code 3368

For "students enrolled" in volunteer/unpaid General and Occupational Cooperative Work Experience, the school district is considered the employer and therefore responsible for Worker's Compensation Insurance for the student.
