III. Update - Extended Ops Mtg. at Chancellor's Office held 12/6//2017 in Sacramento	Lyla provided a report from the Extended Ops Quarterly Meeting held in Sacramento: This meeting, held at CCCCO includes Sector Navigators, Regional Consortium chairs and Technical Assistance Providers (TAPs). Lyla attends representing colleagues - 11 Career Pathway TAPs. Update: CCCCO DSN, SN, and RC, DSN grants are up for competitive bid, RFA will come out Dec 22 for fiscal agent for DSN; fiscal agent will enter into MOUs with colleges that will host DSNs; feeling that when folks don't perform it is difficult to intervene so this may be a way to better manage performance. Contract ED – method of delivering classes cannot collect apportionment if class paid for by business and industry. New Vice Chancellor of Technology, Omid Pourzanjani, did a presentation related to ways to coordinate data among the various colleges. He is working on a portal that would take all the data from various software programs and allow a consistent reporting.	
IV. Update from LA Regional Strong Workforce Program (SWP) Regional Projects	LA Co. Regional SWP projects— consensus reached, we stayed at #1 — we did cut some dollars, no salary cuts, but DSNs were cut to 75\$, then 10% cut across the board from those that did not volunteer cuts; final decision by CEOs will be made in January. The proposal was for Round 2 and Round 3 of SWP Funding. Lyla will get notebook for new folks and schedule a time to meet for an Orientation Session.	
V. Career Pathway Specialists Local Assessment Tool a. Data to date	Review of data to date (See Attached) We are missing data from some of the schools. Data is interesting in that Mt. SAC – 175 articulation agreements, over 1000 that receive credit, however lacking in Dual Enrollment. Lyla stressed the need to assess what works for one high school may not work for another. However, we need to increase the # of students served. There was 248 million dollars invested in SWP and we need to increase the number of students we are serving. 	she can do to help colleges develop Career Pathways utilizing either Articulation or Dual Enrollment strategies.	
VI. Articulation Policies and Procedures	Question raised regarding how long articulation agreements last. Lyla indicated that this needs to be defined in the College Procedure. She suggested it be reviewed on a yearly basis, but at a minimum every two years to align with ED Code related to 2-year program review. a. Timeframe for Reviewb. Regional Recommended BP and CP	Lyla shared the LACCD document related to dual enrollment. The document is a list of all classes that are offered at college that they will allow students to also receive high school credit. Counselor Workshop – March 2, 2018	Invite will be sent out electronically and each of the Career Pathway Specialists are asked to distribute to their high schools and college counselors. 1 st time attendees given priority in order to expand out dissemination of information. Lyla said she would give a prize for CPS that recruits the most counselors from their high schools and community colleges.

a. Narrative Templateb. College Invoice with Supporting Documents	 Lyla stressed that this is only for the LA Ring Colleges CPS. This mini grant is paid out of SB 1070 CTE Career Pathways Program Grant for staff development. January 15, 2018, April 15, 2018, and Final June 15, 2018 Lyla suggested Colleges invoice 4 times, so they can receive money quarterly. First quarter may not have spent since summer but always-due middle of month. October 15, January 15, April 15, and then July 15. Always make sure to include warrant, backup paperwork, docs can be scanned and sent and then the hard copy with appropriate are sent via mail. Narrative portion is key for audit documentation; it must align with expenditures.
