IV. Update of Round 3 Career Pathways Specialists Funding	There has not been a final determination of the budget for the region, but there will be a reduction in the amounts. January will be soonest for agreements of participation to be issued by the fiscal agent. The good news is that we didn't count on round 2, year 2 funding, so we are spending that round of money now and year 3 can be spent until December 31, 2021. Reminder: Round 2 yr. 1 has to be spent by December 31.	
V. Update on K-12 SWP Funding	Webinar today at 3 to discuss the second round of SWP funding for districts. We are waiting for additional information on the K-14 TAPs and K12 Pathways Coordinators. The legislation states that each CCD will get one K12 Pathways Coordinator. More information will be forthcoming.	
VI. Career Pathways Specialists Implementation Reporting Highlights – Due 9/1/2019	Lyla reviewed data we received and asked for opportunities to increase our success. VII. Launching Work Based Learning Strategies	Website development of Career Assessment Tools will be available by spring 2020. This will facilitate students utilizing the www.lacccwc.com site when exploring careers. Once available, we will host a training/orientation for counsellors/faculty and Career Pathways Specialists.	
VIII. CA Cloud Computing	 Strong Workforce Regional Project: Nancy Cardenas, Santa Monica College Two regions working together – via cloud computing; LAOC (19) colleges working on developing their own curriculum; the cloud provides a simple way to move hard drives into the cloud and since everything is moving to cloud – this is an area that companies aren't able to fill jobs. One million jobs want cloud computing skills. We need to ensure our students know this is an opportunity. Each is a 4 or 5 course certificate program; different level of certification, more money paid. Nancy will send out to all the list of courses/programs in the region. Charlotte Augenstein, Regional Director for ICT/DM is working with team to develop and build pipeline of students. This is a certificate where student will be able to work in any industry where these skills are required. 	
IX. Regional Directors for Business Engagement (DSN) Regional Projects	 Global Trade, Ruth Amanuel; Advanced Transportation/Logistics, Catherine Mishler; Business Entrepreneurship, Judy Fox; and Nexus Edge, Eddie Lin Cross sector collaboration that will provide industry perspective in identifying career pathways to be revised to meet industry needs. They have contracted Nexus Edge to provide the labor force to implement the project. They decided to cross collaborate because of the common thread between sectors (i.e., supply chain). 




