I. Welcome and Purpose of Meeting – Dr. Lyla Eddington	Dr. Lyla Eddington, Project Lead SWP Career Pathways Partnership Program began the meeting at 9:33AM. Dr. Eddington welcomed the group and briefly discussed meeting agenda.

III. Project Updates a. Next Round of Funding b. Objectives for 2022-23	<p>Next Round of Funding – Discussions set to begin Friday by LARC as to what next round of funding might look like. Lyla is optimistic that CPP project will become a foundational project and anticipates there will be funding for another year based on past practice and documented outcomes.</p> <p>CCCCO is finalizing revision to CWE Ed Code. The changes will benefit our students and clarify faculty responsibility. CWE is a great opportunity to facilitate a smooth transition from school to work. WBL will continue to be a critical component within the K14 Career Pathways.</p> <p>Objectives for 2022-23 – Lyla gave brief review of 6 objectives to shape our work this year. IV. K 12 Strong Workforce Program Round 5 – Linda Bermudez, K14 TAP	Linda provided a brief update on K12 SWP. The addition of 4 pathways coordinators is a huge accomplishment. The K12 SWP funding provides for 72 K12 Pathway Coordinators statewide (one per community college district and 8 TAPs.) That translates to only 11 positions for all of LA Co. With the additional funds through the Career Pathways Partnership Project, we have four additional K12 PCs. It is very important to highlight this regional investment and stress the importance of collaboration with the Career Pathways Specialists. The K12 staff are actively involved in Round 5 K12 SWP grants as they close on October 18, 2022. It is critical that we leverage Career Pathways Specialists involvement; creating connections between K12 and the community colleges and potential for buy in with match. Linda encouraged both Career Pathways Specialists and K12 PCs to please reach out for support. She noted that the LARC website has round 5 updates. She stated that this is an exciting time to be in LARC.
